We invite papers from **students and faculty** on any topic in Philosophy or Religious Studies. Papers should have a reading time of 15-20 minutes, be prepared for blind review, have a *100-word abstract*, and be submitted electronically in an easily accessible form. Decisions will be made by March 1<sup>st</sup>.

Undergraduate students whose paper is accepted for the conference will have their rooms for Friday night paid by the IAPRS. The top three undergraduate papers will be awarded prizes if the papers are of sufficient merit. Students whose paper wins a prize are encouraged to submit their papers to *Janua Sophia*.
